Skiing Under the Stars! By Becky Ballard



Disabled Kansas Vets May Hunt and Fish for FREE

Eligible veterans may apply for a **FREE** hunting and fishing license in **Kansas**. If you are a Veteran who was separated from the armed services under honorable conditions, are a legal Kansas resident, and have a disability certified by the Kansas Commission on Veterans Affairs with a disability rating of 30 percent or more, you may apply for a free hunting and fishing license. President's Report By Stan Brown

These are indeed difficult economic times; one need only read headlines in the newspaper or listen to the nightly news. I would bet most of us have a relative or close friend who has either lost their job or had problems making their mortgage payments. A friend I've had for 40 years called me last night from another town in another state. He is 62 years old and had worked with the same company 30 years; he was laid off from a



management position a month ago with no hopes of being rehired. If you read my *National Director's Report* in this newsletter, you will see the economic problems of our National PVA organization. I'm very pleased to say our local Gateway Chapter, although receiving a reduced contribution amount from the national organization, will not have to make any reduction in our service to members. Our monthly luncheons and funding of members to participate in recreation and sporting events, will not be affected.

Calling All Hunters

Several PVA Chapters sponsor hunts in the spring or fall for deer or turkey. Gateway has been looking into sponsoring such a hunt if there is sufficient interest. We are looking at hunting sites near Springfield, Missouri (a state conservation area), Camp Hope near Farmington, Missouri, and a state conservation area at Rend Lake, Illinois close to St. Louis. If Gateway PVA paid for nearby lodging the first year and set up the hunt, would anyone be interested? Whatever site we choose would have guides to help get hunters to hunting spots or blinds. I'm not sure about furnishing weapons (I guess you hunters call them guns, but I can always remember getting yelled at in boot camp for using the word "guns") or ammunition. There are a lot of details we will have to work out. But first, and it's a big FIRST, I want to make sure we have enough interest among our members. So if you have any interest, please call our 800-number (800-426-4058) or local number (314-427-0393) and give us your name, preferred location to hunt, and leave your phone number. If we don't get any response, we won't pursue this idea.

Membership Participation

Our Board of Directors in January approved funding levels for individuals wanting to go to the Winter Sports Clinic. Individuals who have been active with PVA events will receive \$1200. The summer wheelchair games in Spokane, Washington will soon be upon us and will no doubt be costly. Gateway PVA, like most PVA chapters, has a participation point system which has been in effect now for three years. Bobby Jackson and Mike Norris have written about this funding and how to earn it, several times in our newsletter. I am still amazed when someone says they don't know how to get funding. In addition to funding for sporting events, the Board recently approved using participation points for various "night out" events to encourage participation. We have also approved earning points by calling our membership with some survey questions. To date, only board members have volunteered to do that calling. In sum, I'm saying the Board has really made an effort to make earning these participation points for funding, as easy as possible. Another thing I heard in boot camp was there are only two possible responses: Yes Sir and No Excuses Sir.



National Director's Report Stanley D. Brown


I've just returned from driving 2000 miles round-trip for the 2009 Mid-Winter Board of Directors Meeting held in Orlando, Florida. Although the location sounds glamorous, on every day but the last, our meetings lasted until 5 p.m. Once I got to Florida, I had problems getting my chair properly charged, and on the way home we had a blowout on the right front tire right before crossing the Mississippi into Missouri. In addition to these problems, I was disappointed in some of the resolutions not being passed. Other news from the meeting was very good.

Our Gateway Chapter nominated, and the National Board of Directors by voting, selected our own Dr. Robert Woolsey to be the 2009 non-member Speedy Award recipient. This is the highest award PVA can give to a non-member; it is given for "significant contributions to improving the lives of America's paralyzed veterans." Dr. Woolsey is obviously deserving of the award, and as noted in our nominating packet, he has served our SCI community for 45 years. He has been a special friend to the Gateway PVA and recently named a Fellow in the American Paraplegia Society. Dr. Woolsey will be flown down to receive the award in person at the PVA Annual Convention in August in Miami, Florida.

There were initially 18 resolutions proposed for the Mid-Winter BOD Meeting. Gateway submitted two, one was withdrawn for lack of support and the other was defeated, although getting a majority vote but not a two-thirds requirement. For several years, Gateway and I have felt the national organization is not best served with the existing weighted voting system whereby chapters with more members get more votes. Resolutions to change that system have passed with a majority vote but failed to receive the two thirds required majority. After being approached to do so, I submitted on behalf of Gateway a resolution that partially gave a larger chapter additional funding for the increased numbers of members as opposed to increased voting power. The resolution failed anyway. I also initially submitted a resolution to make all national officers and vice presidents volunteers, like myself and our local Gateway Board of Directors, but withdrew the resolution when I realized there wasn't sufficient support. Another resolution withdrawn concerned PVA eliminating reimbursement for alcoholic beverages as part of the travel per diem granted. Gateway did not submit the resolution, but I supported the concept.

The national economy and difficult charity giving market for our national organization, has resulted in an operating budget shortfall. It was proposed and I supported, a resolution to reduce the individual PVA chapter's contribution amount from the national organization for the rest of this fiscal year in the amount of \$25,000, which equals a savings of \$850,000 after multiplying the 34 chapters times the \$25,000 amount. In addition, there will be \$3 million in reductions in the national PVA operating budget. Even with these cuts, which I am convinced were needed, there will be no reduction in services on the local level for Gateway Chapter members. As always, please feel free to contact me with any questions or concerns.

Please have someone contact our Chapter in the event of a member's death so that we can inform other members who might wish to pay their respects to the departed.

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Eastern Kansas Health Care Facilities Site Visit

The Topeka, Kansas and Leavenworth, Kansas Veterans Health Administration (VHA) Hospitals were visited on September 9-10, 2008. This visit was a focused spinal cord injury/disease (SCI/D) medical site visit of the Eastern Kansas Health Care System. Site team members consisted of Judith Elmore, R.N. Associate Director of Medical Services, National Office Committee Member, Pedro De Armas of the PVA Field Advisory



Committee, Mark Stever, National Service Officer III, and Bonnie Hilburn, Senior National Service Officer.

Dr. Florian Thomas, Chief of Spinal Cord Injury Center at the Jefferson Barracks VHA from St. Louis, MO accompanied the team. This was a first for the Jefferson Barracks SCI/D Chief. The local facility Director and administrative staff were also involved.

Both facilities were clean and welcoming. They are in the process of expanding and remodeling with new rehabilitative hi-low mats and overhead lifts. Additional bariatric wheelchair scales and weighing devices, attached to the existing overhead lifts are being evaluated. Since there are no side rails on the clinic hi-low mats, efforts will be undertaken to ensure patient safety when using these mats in the clinic rooms.

Issues discussed were van accessible parking, as both facilities didn't meet the ADA required 132 inches of van exit space. Also, in Topeka there were vehicles parked in "Van Accessible" marked spaces. Another issue was wheelchair accessible public bathroom accessibility.

Ongoing SCI/D and educational opportunities need to be offered to other hospital staff working with SCI/D veterans. The need for SCI/D staffing with a SCI doctor at both facilities was reviewed and suggested. These facilities aren't presently being considered the SCI/D patient's primary care provider. Confusion arises when consults or forms are being completed since the local SCI/D Primary Care Team actually sees the individual more than the primary care provider.

Some patients with SCI/D Category 7-8 may be being charged co-payments at the \$50 specialty rate instead of being charged \$15 for the primary care provider rate. The site team understood that this issue was already being reviewed. PVA will continue to monitor this issue. Other issues included annual exams being done at Jefferson Barracks SCI/D Center and better communication between the established Hub and Spokes facilities.

A problem voiced by both VHA facilities was that SCI/D patients weren't keeping their appointments. This "no show" hurts the effectiveness in the SCI Clinic and their reportable numbers needed to justify more staffing. Therefore, it's important to keep those appointments for your SCI/D clinic exams.

An extensive report went directly to the Department of Veterans Affairs Central Office (VACO) in Washington, D.C. and to our National PVA Headquarters. We will continue to follow the progression and implementation of all Medical Site Team recommendations. 
