



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I HELD MY BREATH

It was a cool November in 2015. The air felt good in my nostrils and the sweat felt great against my arms as I was near completion of a 5K run. I finished before my husband; we both had a good laugh (more me than him) about it. The rest of the day was uneventful after we got home that Friday afternoon tired and hungry. I remember dropping my glass of water but ignored it because I had been told I suffer from carpal tunnel syndrome. I felt off but I could not tell what was causing it.

I could not move my left side when I woke up Saturday morning. After an ER visit, followed by doctors' appointments at the VA, cervical spine surgery was completed on that following May. We held our breaths convinced that full recovery would follow and eager to go back to the running trail for a rematch. I told him: "If I walk again, we will dress up in period costumes and go to the KC Renaissance Fair" With the assistance of a quad cane, we did. Our costumes were so good that several people asked if we worked there!

After two years of intermittent physical therapy, it was evident that running was out of the question, I continued holding my breath while ignoringmy favorite hobbies: sewing, crocheting, and drawing, riding bicycle (now tricycle) and walking even at a snail's pace. Numb fingers, shaking hands, and wobbly legs were betraying me at each try. I felt angry, sad, depressed, and lost the will to even exercise. I became a recluse and shed friendships, canceled plans, and was not seen or heard from much for a long time. That period was a blur, but I remember the darkness we were living in.

Seven years later I walked in the Saint Louis JB SCI Clinic for an intake appointment. We were both jaded and were not expecting much but figured it could not hurt. To my surprise, there was a team of

medical professionals dedicated to bringing a measure of independence and care specific to my needs. I was in awe at the compassion and respect afforded to us by everyone we interacted with that day. A plan was put in place and an arsenal of tools was provided to us to help with our day-to-day activities in a safer way. One of the tools provided to us was the daily VVC toga, mindfulness, stretch and strengthening, and the cooking class which I reluctantly joined. The friendship and camaraderie during those meetings have made an impact on our lives. The play button has been pressed, and slowly we are beginning to take those metaphorical deep breaths that had ceased that distant November day. I realized I had two choices: to accept a new normal while learning to do things differently and continue to live and create new experiences or simply give up completely.

I am happy to report we have chosen the former, not the latter and although there are a lot of thorns along this path and sometimes the dark cloud cover is above, we now perceive the roses to be more fragrant after the storms. He took up trout fishing and I opened my sewing room, dusted my sewing machine, and began the lengthy process of re-learning the skill another way while spending time making donation items. It will be hard, but we know in the end it will be much better for us to live knowing that our breaths are precious, and emotions must be felt.

I conclude with an anonymous phrase:

"You must go through it to get through it, you must remember to take deep breaths along the way"

MY PVA EXPERIENCE

Let me tell you about my experience in joining, or trying to join The Paralyzed Veterans of America organization. If it was not for a dear friend of mine, Norm Keller I would not have known PVA existed. He was receiving care from the therapists at the SCI/D clinic and going to the monthly luncheons that the Gateway Chapter provided.

During one of our visits with Norm and Henrietta, he mentioned PVA and wanted to know why I was not a member and going to these luncheons. Anyway, I went to the SCI/D center and got evaluated, and was qualified to receive care through that unit. I do not quite remember where I got the PVA application, but I filled it out and provided all my medical history and it was submitted to PVA Headquarters. I was told by the Gateway Chapter that I was accepted, but nothing had been received from National stating I was a member. I started going to the monthly luncheons with Norm and each month I would ask the Executive Director, Chris Blanchard if he received anything yet. After a couple of months, Chris resubmitted the application, along with my medical history. This went on for what, seemed like forever, and each time I went to the luncheons I was getting these strange looks. After many telephone calls and text messages the application was finally approved, and I received my PVA Membership card.

Now that I was a documented member of PVA and a Gateway Chapter member I started going to the monthly board meetings. Since I was new during the first few meetings, I just kind of sat back and watched what was going on. After a few meetings I was feeling ready to participate, so when first and second motions came around, I would second motions as others were slow in responding. President Stan Brown quickly informed me that I could not, as I wasn't a board member. He put me in my seat. I regularly attended the monthly

meetings

and eventually became a member of the board. From there I became Treasurer, and am now a board member and the National Director for the Gateway Chapter.

If it was not for Norm Keller and talking with other PVA members, I would not have known about all the PVA, VA and Chapter benefits and support out there for which I was entitled. PVA is not a well branded organization, but PVA National is working to correct that. You as a PVA members should, when seeing others, especially anyone in a wheelchair, or hear about someone with MS or ALS inquire if they are a veteran. If so, it is your responsibility to inform them about PVA and the Gateway Chapter. We should wear our PVA shirts and hats whenever we are out and about promoting PVA. You do not know if you do not know.
