President's Message

Great Gateway Giveaway of Accessible Transportation

Early this summer we found ourselves in the enviable position of having a nice reserve of liquid assets. This, in large part, has come from prudent financial management and the rise in the stock market over the last several months. I would be remiss if I also didn't mention the unbelievable success of our annual charity golf tournament last September, which has been phenomenal thanks to our volunteers. Early this summer the Board of Directors voted to spend a substantial sum (just over \$100,000) to purchase used, low mileage, accessible vehicles for a member drawing. The end result, as noted on the front page, is that we purchased four vehicles for a total cost of \$101,500. All four vehicles have now been given to members and we (Gateway) are paying for hand controls for those able to drive.

Not unexpectedly, the most difficult question was the selection of the vehicle recipients. By a letter to all our members with addresses, I informed membership of our program to purchase and give away vehicles. Members were invited to email or write to us and describe their need for a vehicle and what difference it would make in their life. We received 26 responses and from that narrowed it down to the 15 "most deserving." The 15 names were then placed in a tin and board members at our June meeting drew eight names in order. I then "vetted" those names as best I could for actual need, criminal history record, and ability to use and maintain the vehicle. We then tried to match the vehicles we were considering with the individuals. The vehicles were ultimately purchased from two local vendors, an Illinois resident (ad in the paper a board member saw), and one of our members. We are hoping these vehicles make a big difference in the lives of the recipients, and help them realize Gateway's vision of "living life to the fullest."

Big Changes Coming in VA Healthcare?

I put a "?" on the title for this section because I'm not sure anyone really knows what the VA system for our healthcare is going to finally look like. The \$16 billion Veterans Access, Choice and Accountability Act has now been signed into law. In recent months the VA has been all over the news, highlighted with the delays and cover-up of those delays and appointments at the Phoenix VA. On the national level, in response to these issues and congressional inquiries, PVA has responded both in written and oral testimony. This month (August 2014) there are PN magazine articles from the PVA Executive Director (Homer Townsend) and the magazine's editor (Richard Hoover), that provide an excellent analysis of what's going on and the possible consequences. PVA and I both have concerns with the rapidity of the consideration of the bills, the effect of expanding access to non-VA contract care, and maintaining the significant value of specialized VA care. The many values and benefits of a SCI/D unit, with specialized professional staff and the camaraderie/therapeutic value of the veterans being together, will be lost in piecemeal contract service arrangements with area private hospitals.

I Can't Believe She's Leaving—MaryAnn Jacobs (NP)

The nicest, smartest, best nurse a fellow veteran could ask for, is retiring in September. Nurse Practitioner Mary Ann will be leaving the Jefferson Barracks SCI/D unit, the new six-bed acute care unit at John Cochran, and wherever else she was needed, to travel with her husband and spend time with grandchildren. I don't often say this, but she will be "irreplaceable." I know she will miss me interrupting her 15 minute lunch breaks to ask her questions or reorder a script. Gateway and all its members will miss this wonderful lady, but wish her the best of retirements!

Mrs. Mary Ann started Nursing School at Jewish Hospital School of Nursing, then continued on at the University of Illinois for a Bachelor's of Science in Nursing (BSN). She then received her Master's in Nursing from St. Louis University. She's an Advanced Practical Nurse (APN).

Returning to the Workforce

Are you considering returning to the workforce? Answer these 4 questions before embarking on your career search:

- Are you really ready to reenter the job market?
- Have you kept up with the trends and issues impacting your industry?
- Are your skills current and up to date?
- Do you have realistic expectations of today's workplace?

Below are three tips on how to return to the workforce like you never left:

1. Beautify your resume and/or cover letter.

Break down all your skills and put them on a functional resume, one that focuses on your skills and abilities, not a chronological resume, that focuses on work history. Then, once you are face-to-face with an employer figure out ways to showcase your skills and successes through meaningful and relatable anecdotes. For example, if you've renovated your home, explain that enormous undertaking and your role in managing it.

2. Develop Yourself-Turn time out into time well spent!

Be ready to articulate what you've been doing and why it's relevant to what you want to do next. Seek out your transferable skills. You'll need to package them in a way that shows you are ready, willing and qualified to handle anything that comes your way. Hopefully, you have maintained your credentials, kept your skills sharp, and/or enrolled in training/classes; if not there is still a silver lining: there is a looming labor shortage that means many employers will be willing to look at nontraditional candidates and obtaining additional training is easier than ever. There are several websites where you can enroll in classes from the comfort of home. Some are free and others paid. Some examples are: Coursera (which offers free courses) and Udemy (which has both free and paid courses). Coursera has more than 600 free courses from top universities and organizations.

3. Network

You must focus on meeting people the same way you do in other aspects of life: through mutual friends and contacts. Connect with former colleagues and working friends. Ask for leads on jobs and ask for other contacts. Another great way to meet people in your industry is to join a professional group. You'll find associations in every field as well as working women support groups and LinkedIn. Even your alumni association—no matter how long ago you graduated—is a stellar resource.


